Carly believes that as a TUAS operatorpeople are the capability. After the Arline Pilot dispute in 1989. Deborah relocated to Holland and flew with KLM for the next 16 years. She became a Captain in 1994 and was closely involved with Aviation Safety and Incident Investigation for many years serving on several international committees. Deborah returned to Australia in 2008 and flew with Jetstar based in Christchurch.

In 2014 she joined Tiger Airways where she flew as a check and training Captain on the Airbus A320 until the airline was shut down during COVID. Deborah has recently resumed flying with Virgin. In 2019, Deborah was made a Member of the Order of Australia at the 2019 Queen's Birthday Honors in recognition of her significant service to aviation as a commercial pilot and to women in the profession. In June 2020, she was inducted into the Australian aviation Hall of Fame.
